**\*Confession of Faith: Westminster Confession of Faith**, Chapter 11 — Of Justification, sections 1, 2, and 3  
Pastor: Believers in Christ, what do you confess concerning your justification by faith?

**Congregation:** Those whom God effectually calls He also freely justifies; not by infusing righteousness into them, but by pardoning their sins, and by accounting and accepting their persons as righteous: not for anything wrought in them, or done by them, but for Christ's sake alone: nor by imputing faith itself, the act of believing, or any other evangelical obedience, to them as their righteousness; but by imputing the obedience and satisfaction of Christ to them, they receiving and resting on Him and His righteousness, by faith: which faith they have not of themselves; it is the gift of God.

Faith, thus receiving and resting on Christ and His righteousness, is the only instrument of justification; yet is it not alone in the person justified, but is ever accompanied with all other saving graces, and is no dead faith, but works by love.

Christ, by His obedience and death, did fully discharge the debt of all those that are thus justified, and did make a proper, real, and full satisfaction to His Father's justice on their behalf. Yet, inasmuch as He was given by the Father for them, and His obedience and satisfaction accepted in their place, and both, freely, not for anything in them, their justification is only of free grace; that both the exact justice and rich grace of God might be glorified in the justification of sinners.
